

KATHERINE 'KAY' JOYCE ZINK, 69, of 64 Oak Street Extension, Dalton, died Monday afternoon at Berkshire Medical Center. Born in Hudson Falls, New York, on November 5, 1933, the daughter of Enos A. and Laura B. Paquette Benham, she was a 1951 graduate of St. Joseph Central High School.
